### **MYRISH C. ANTONIO**

The presenter is an icon of public speaking even at a tender age of 12 when she was spotted in the Division Wide Declamation and Oratorical Contest which paved way for her to be the youngest newscaster in Dumaguete City with DYEM-FM.

Today, she is the Director of the Jovito Salonga Law Center of Silliman University and a professor of Law. She has a degree in Arts major in Political Science and graduated as Magna Cum Laude and Most Outstanding Student of Year. She earned her Bachelor of Laws as Cum Laude and eventually finished her Master in Laws at the George Washington University, Washington DC, USA.

#### DAVE G. SACEDA

Is a late bloomer in public speaking. He is a person who believes that constant practice makes one better. He started developing his linguistic skills while in college as emcee in several university programs and as an usher of the Luce Auditorium. Today, he is a leadership consultant and motivational speaker giving leadership trainings in the Philippines and abroad through Saceda Youth Lead.
