

The National Research Council of the Philippines (NRCP), an agency of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST), takes pride in the recent election of Prof. Felipe M. De Leon Jr., as new Chairman of the National Commission for Culture and the Arts (NCCA).

Prof. Felipe De Leon, Jr. is a composer who has done several studies in Philippine musicology, whose contribution to society, among others, is the development of the use of the arts for understanding people's culture. A professor of humanities, aesthetics, music theory, Philippine arts and culture at the University of the Philippines, he also serves as a distinguished lecturer on social transformation at Asian Social Institute. He is a graduate of the University of the Philippines-Diliman (Cum Laude) In the scientific community, he serves as Chairman of the NRCP Division of Humanities. He is the son of Felipe Padilla De Leon, National Artist for Music.



Maria Nieves R. Confesor, popularly known as Nieves Confesor, is the former Executive Director of the Asian Institute of Management (AIM) Team Energy Center for Bridging Leadership. She was the first woman to assume the position of Dean at AIM since the Institute's foundation in 1968. Confesor earned a Bachelor of Arts in Literary Studies, magna cum laude and class valedictorian from Maryknoll College (now Miriam College) in 1971. She obtained a Master of Business Administration from the Ateneo Graduate School of Business in 1978.

She earned a Master of Public Policy and Administration degree from the John F. Kennedy School of Government of Harvard University, as an Edward S. Mason Fellow, in 1990. She also took special courses in Labor and Employment and in Asian Studies at the University of the Philippines; and in International Economics, Negotiations, Women in Politics at Harvard University.

He was a Youth Ambassador of Goodwill in the 23rd Ship for the South East Asian Youth Program having traveled to 10 ASEAN nations to promote peace and mutual understanding among the youth. He was elected the youngest Vice Mayor in the Philippines and had served Laguna as Board Member.</p> <p>Vince holds a degree in Arts major in Sociology from the University of the Philippines (cum laude) and earned his Masters in Developmental Studies. He is an Assistant Professor at the College of Saint Benilde, De La Salle University in Manila.</p>

She is also the vice chair of the 2014 National Training for Teachers of Social Studies.
