MENTAL HEALTH FAIR 2018 PROJECT-BASED LEARNING COMPETITION

WHAT IS OUR CONCERN?

Mental Health and wellbeing are now the focus of many advocacy and intervention programs not only in schools but also in communities as well. The rising number of depression and suicide cases in the country and even in Cebu Island have given way for great concern. Along this line, the Department of Health is initiating a competition that will focus on developing projects that aim in increasing knowledge, awareness and influencing behavior on Mental Health issues, particularly on: bullying, depression and suicide.

HOW TO JOIN?

- A. Create a team with your friends, classmates, or schoolmates.
- B. Have your school head assign a teacher-in-charge and endorse your team.
- C. After getting endorsement, submit your team name and team members using the Registration Form **provided**.
- D. Submit photocopies of your school I.D.s (including the I.D of your teacher-in-charge) together with your registration form and email your registration form together with the scanned I.D.s to: mentalhealthfair2018@gmail.com.
- E. After validating your team registration, you will be invited to attend an orientation briefing on September 14, 3:00 p.m. at the Coalition for Better Education (CBE) office, Cebu Normal University Campus, Osmena Blvd., Cebu City.
- F. During the orientation, the contest organizers will give you a Project-based learning (PBL) activity that you will work on.
 - a. *Project-based learning is a student-centered pedagogy that involves a dynamic classroom approach in which it is believed that students acquire a deeper knowledge through active exploration of real-world challenges and problems (edutopia.org).*
- G. Failure to attend the orientation session will mean disqualification from the contest;
- H. All PBL outputs should be submitted to mentalhealthfair2018@gmail.com on or before September 28, 2018 (12 MN).

DATA PRIVACY

- A. CBE and DOH shall have the right to record, copy, publish, edit, exhibit, distribute, perform, merchandise, license, sublicense, adapt and/or modify all materials and presentations in any way, in any and all media, without any compensation or consideration to any team or its members;
- B. By submitting materials, teams agree for publicity engagements, media exposure, interview, photo and video recording that is related to the contest;
- C. All submitted materials shall remain the property of DOH.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- A. DOH and CBE shall not be responsible for any failed registrations.
- B. DOH and CBE has the right to cancel any team in the contest for any good cause and its reasonable discretion especially in violation of Official Contest Rules.
- C. DOH and CBE reserve the right to amend these rules and policies.
- D. Entries coming from public schools shall secure travel orders from their respective division offices for all activities related to the competition;
- E. The Top Winner will receive: **P 20,000** cash prize and plaque; while the runner-up will receive **P 12,000** cash prize and plaque.
- F. The winning entry shall agree to use at least 60% of the cash prize to fund the winning proposal. While the runner-up shall agree to use at least 30% of the cash prize to fund the winning proposal.

By entering in the contest, each team and members agree to abide with all the rules and decisions of DOH and CBE and the judges relating to the contest.

- E. The contest organizers will review the PBL outputs and proposal given time constraints as well as adherence to topic, content, branding and integrity.
- F. Accepted teams will be invited to present their proposals to a panel of experts on October 4, 2018, 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. at the CBE-CefTEx Office, Cebu Normal University Campus, Osmeña Boulevard, Cebu City.
- G. Only three (3) members of the team plus the teacher-in-charge are required to present on October 4.
- H. Team presenters should wear appropriate business attire during the oral defense.
- I. Failure to present means disqualification to the contest.

FINAL REPORT SUBMISSION

- A. Teams are required to submit their Final Outputs and Proposal for judging.
- B. Only submission from registered classes/teams will be accepted. Submission of outputs will be done online.
- C. All Final Reports must be received on or before September 28 12:00 Midnight, in order to be included in the judging. Late submissions will not be accepted. No team may enter more than one (1) entry.
- D. There shall be no revisions made on the outputs once submitted as an entry.
- E. Required Deliverables:
 - a. PBL Outputs
 - b. Mental Health School Activity Proposal
- F. Teams may produce submission in native language however, translation should be provided;
- G. Teams are not allowed to contract with, or pay for, any outside consulting firm, agency or other service for any assistance or guidance in the creation of Required Deliverables.
- H. All Required Deliverables must consist solely of the original work product of the team that submits each entry.

JUDGING

- A. The Administering Parties will determine judges from experts and schools not participating in the contest.
- B. Entries will be evaluated using specific judging criteria/rubrics.
- C. All decisions made by the judges are final.
- D. The organizing body will select five (5) finalists from all entries submitted.
- E. Out of the five (5) finalists, two (2) Top awards will be given.

- I. Accepted outputs will be invited to undergo a face to face oral defense in front of a panel of experts on October 4, 2018.
- J. Only two winners will be chosen: a) Top Prize and a b) runner-up which will be announced during the culminating program on October 10, 2018.

WHO CAN JOIN?

- A. The contest is open to all official and registered:
 - i. Grade 10 to Grade 12 students of public and private junior and senior high schools in Cebu;
- B. There is no limit as to the number of students per team. However, teams should have more or less equal number of female and male members.
- C. Team members need to be enrolled at the same school to participate together as one team.
- D. Each team should have a bonafide teacher-in-charge (currently holding a teaching position in your school) who shall oversee the progress of the team's activities. A team who does not have a teacher-in-charge will be disqualified from the competition;
- E. Employees of the Administering Parties, and their parents, subsidiaries, affiliated companies, advertising and promotion agencies, immediate family members and/or those living in the same household of anyone so employed or engaged are not eligible to compete in the Contest.

HOW SHOULD WE DO IT?

- A. Teams are required to undergo all tasks outlined in the PBL Activity. The tasks outlined leads to the writing of a proposal that will address a particular Mental Health Issue or Concern;
- B. The teacher-in-charge reviews and endorses the PBL outputs of the team. The teacher-in-charge should validate that all activities have been undertaken by the team before the proposal was made;
- C. If ascertained that the team skipped one process in the PBL Activity, the team will be automatically disqualified.
- D. After getting endorsement from the teacher-in-charge, the team submits their outputs and proposal to mentalhealthfair2018@gmail.com, attention: Ms. Katleen Manlangit.
